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OUR KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

RABBI BENAY LAPPE: Rabbi Benay Lappe is the founder of SVARA, a "traditionally radical yeshiva" that studies Jewish text from a queer perspective. Ordained by The Jewish Theological Seminary in 1997, Rabbi Lappe is an awardwinning educator specializing in the application of queer theory to Talmud study. She was named as one of the *Forward's* "Most Inspiring Rabbis" in 2014 and is a 2016 recipient of the prestigious Covenant Award for innovative Jewish education.



RABBI GIL STEINLAUF: Rabbi Gil Steinlauf, senior rabbi at Adas Israel Congregation in Washington, DC, is widely respected for his success in reenvisioning the nature of this historic synagogue. Rabbi Steinlauf is the first senior rabbi of a large, historic, Conservative congregation to come out as gay, and through his honesty, has sought to create an atmosphere of constructive dialogue on the issues facing modern culture and Judaism.



RABBI AMICHAI LAU-LAVIE: Rabbi Amichai Lau-Lavie is the founding spiritual leader of Lab/Shul NYC and the creator of Storahtelling, Inc. An Israeli-born Jewish educator, writer, and performance artist, he received his rabbinical ordination from The Jewish Theological Seminary in 2016. Rabbi Amichai has been hailed as "an iconoclastic mystic" by *Time Out New York*, and in 2016 the *Forward* named him one of the 32 "Most Inspiring Rabbis" in America.
