One of our country's most prominent journalists, you have served as a trusted voice in times of crisis.

You grew up in Buffalo as the child of Holocaust survivors, going on to earn a BA from the State University of New York at Buffalo and an MA from the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies.

You began your career in 1972 with the Reuters News Agency in Tel Aviv, after which you became the *Jerusalem Post's* Washington, DC, correspondent. You joined CNN in 1990, serving first as the network's military affairs correspondent at the Pentagon, then as senior White House correspondent, and later as anchor of CNN's Sunday public affairs program *Late Edition with Wolf Blitzer*. For the past eighteen years, you have anchored *The Situation Room with Wolf Blitzer*.

Over the decades, you have reported on a wide range of major breaking stories that have shaped the international political landscape. You covered the first Israeli-Egyptian peace conference in Egypt in 1977, and, from Moscow in 1991, the collapse of the Soviet Union. Your interviews with some of the most notable figures of our times—including numerous US presidents, the Dalai Lama, Mikhail Gorbachev, and Nelson Mandela—have shaped news cycles and changed conversations both domestically and internationally. The numerous honors you have received for your reporting include an Emmy Award for Lifetime Achievement.

Inspired by your Jewish heritage, you have worked tirelessly to promote Holocaust education and combat antisemitism throughout your career. In 2022, you produced *Never Again: The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum: A Tour with Wolf Blitzer* for CNN, an impactful and deeply personal report, which was awarded the prestigious Grand Prize Award from Germany's RIAS Berlin Commission. In 2023, you traveled to Poland to participate in the 35th International March of the Living and to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising.

Your insightful reporting has unfailingly kept us informed about the state of our nation and the world, serving as an essential beacon for democracy.

Dr. Gail Twersky Reimer

Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa

A visionary pioneer of Jewish feminism, you have played an incomparable role in expanding our appreciation for the inestimable impact of Jewish women.

A graduate of Sarah Lawrence College, you received your PhD in English and American Literature from Rutgers University and began your career as a faculty member of Wellesley College. You worked to increase women's representation in the curriculum and participated in the college's new women's studies program. From 1989 to 1995, you served as Associate Director of the Massachusetts Foundation for the Humanities. You conceived and co-edited two pathbreaking anthologies of Jewish women's writings—*Reading Ruth: Women Reclaim a Sacred Story* and *Beginning Anew: A Woman's Companion to the High Holy Days*.

In 1995, you founded the Jewish Women's Archive, the only national organization dedicated entirely to Jewish women's history. Your inspirations were the stories you heard from your parents, who were Holocaust survivors, and the work of a rising group of feminist historians. Your goal was to ensure that Jewish women's stories—so often unknown or overlooked—would become integral parts of the historical record, and you have succeeded beyond measure.

Thanks to your prescience in establishing the archive as a digital repository open to anyone with internet access, you have captured the imagination of scholars, supporters, and web users of all ages from across the globe. The Jewish Women's Archive quickly became the go-to source for information about Jewish women and their impact on all aspects of Judaism and Jewish life and on society at large. The Jewish Women's Archive has also generated new material about Jewish women and has become an essential contributor to a more expansive vision of the Jewish world.

You have received numerous awards, including the 2012 American Jewish Distinguished Service Award from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion. Since retiring as the Executive Director of the Jewish Women's Archive in 2014, you produced and directed a film about Regina Jonas, the first woman to be ordained as a rabbi, and continue to research and write about Jewish women.

Your vital work has not only transformed our understanding of the breadth and scope of Jewish women's history and experience, but it has also helped shape a more inclusive Jewish future.

Dr. John Sexton

Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa

A transformational leader, you have pioneered innovations in higher education that have profoundly impacted our increasingly global world.

President Emeritus of New York University, Dean Emeritus of New York University School of Law, and the Benjamin Butler Professor of Law, you were educated at Fordham University and Harvard Law School.

From 1988 to 2002, you served as dean of NYU School of Law; under your tenure, NYU became one of the top five law schools in the country according to *U.S. News & World Report*. From 2002 to 2015, you served as the fifteenth president of NYU, during which time the university's stature rose dramatically into the ranks of the world's top universities. Under your leadership, NYU became the world's first global network university, opening successful degree-granting campuses in Abu Dhabi and Shanghai.

In 2016, you founded and for five years served as CEO of the Catalyst Foundation for Universal Education, providing over \$25 million in grants to educate underserved refugee and displaced children around the world.

You have authored numerous works, including a leading casebook on civil procedure and *Redefining the Supreme Court's Role: A Theory of Managing the Federal Court System.* Your much loved 2013 book, *Baseball as a Road to God: Seeing Beyond the Game*, is based on an undergraduate seminar you teach at NYU each spring and was a *New York Times* bestseller. Your latest book, *Standing for Reason*, discusses the sacred role universities play in safeguarding and promoting conversation within the bounds of civil discourse.

In addition to your work as President Emeritus, you are a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the Council on Foreign Relations, and you serve on the board of the Institute of International Education. Previously, you chaired the American Council on Education.

You are the recipient of numerous awards, including the Institute for International Education's Dugan Prize, the UN Global Coalition's Award for Education Leadership, and the Open University of Israel's Alon Prize.

The landscape of higher education, geographically and intellectually, has evolved in ever more essential ways thanks to your incisive mind, your boundless energy, and your commitment to the common good.

Professor Yair Zakovitch

Doctor of Hebrew Letters, honoris causa

One of the world's most original Bible scholars, you have reached beyond the confines of the academy, bringing Bible study closer to the hearts and minds of the Israeli public.

Emeritus Father Takeji Otsuki Professor of Bible at Hebrew University, you were born in Haifa and earned a BA at the University of Haifa and an MA and PhD at Hebrew University. You joined the Hebrew University faculty while in graduate school and remained until your retirement in 2010. Since then, you have continued to teach at Hebrew University and at other eminent institutions including Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, Harvard University, and JTS. In 2021, you received the Israel Prize in Biblical Studies for your extraordinary contributions to biblical scholarship.

Your primary interests are the literary analysis of the Bible, the history of beliefs and ideas in the Bible, biblical historiography, and early Jewish and Christian interpretation of the Bible. You have written numerous commentaries, monographs, and articles. Among the highlights of your publications are *Between Inner- and Extra-biblical Interpretation, Jacob: Unexpected Patriarch*, and books you co-authored with your good friend Avigdor Shinan on the history of biblical interpretation, including *From Gods to God: How the Bible Debunked, Suppressed, or Changed Ancient Myths and Legends*. You have also explored the relationship between the New Testament and the Hebrew Bible, and you published a collection of poems, *Jesus Reads the Gospels*.

In Israel, you are a sought-after lecturer, engaging both educators and popular audiences. You have been well-received across the country including at Masorti institutions in Haifa, Jerusalem, and Tel Aviv. You were central to the founding of Hebrew University's Revivim Program, which trains outstanding university students to teach Bible and Jewish studies in state schools.

You have described the relationship between the Jewish people and the Bible as one in which "a people created a book and the book created the people," and your work strengthening this connection will be felt for generations to come.

Project Judaica

Central to the revival of Jewish life and learning in Ukraine, Project Judaica is a unique program sponsored by JTS in cooperation with the Institute of Oriental Studies of the Ukrainian Academy of Sciences in Kyiv. Students enrolled in its certificate program go on to assume leadership positions in Ukrainian Jewish communities and in Jewish scholarship.
